From the Chair

Die terugvoering na die AJV was oor die algemeen positief. Namens u wat dit nie kon bywoon nie, wil ek my dank teenoor die UK uitspreek vir al die harde werk en toewyding. Die UK is mandate gegee betreffende SEKURITEIT en die voorgestelde MARIENE RESERVAAT. Daar is ook besluit dat die VISIE VIR ROOIELS 'n dinamiese dokument is wat van tyd tot tyd hiersien en aangepas moet word om die vinnige veranderinge in ons omgewing te akkommodeer.

SECURITY

SECURITY is possibly uppermost in many minds in these days of high crime statistics, bomb blasts and brutality. There are three possibilities which should help to contain and even reduce these in our area:

- **KOGELBERG BIOSPHERE RESERVE:**

The Helderberg municipal investigation and initiative on its coastal parks and amenities (Including Kogelbaai) envisages a TOLLGATE at the entrance to the Kogelberg Biosphere Reserve. Based on the worldwide trend towards ensuring that ecotourism should be self-funding, it is one of the longer-term recommendations made by

Bowren Consultants who have studied overseas trends and facilities. Obviously, public participation will be required before this idea comes to fruition, and Bowren's Mr Pallis has assured the RERA that Rooielers will be consulted along with the rest of the Hangklip/Kleinmond area. Mr Pallis also reassured a meeting which I attended that the most modern technology will be used to ensure that local inhabitants are not prejudiced financially or inconvenienced unduly by long queues. Experienced travellers will know that this is quite feasible, even on roads carrying far greater traffic volumes than Clarence Drive. While a tollgate cannot differentiate between "badies" and "goodies" and keep the former out, allied to other security initiatives, it could provide an additional financial and psychological deterrent.

• SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS:

If you were looking for a place to commit a crime and at the entrance to the Hangklip/Kleinmond area were confronted by large signs reading:

YOU ARE ENTERING A ZERO-TOLERANCE CRIME AREA AND ARE BEING MONITORED BY SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS

would you not think twice and perhaps look elsewhere for a victim? Just such a scheme is currently under consideration and will possibly be funded by a R5 monthly levy per plot.

• ROOIELS SECURITY BOOM

Closure of the Porter Drive entrance to Rooiel and the erection of a boom at the four-way stop in the Rooiel business centre has long been a subject of discussion. However, consider the legal and logistical problems! One possible way to overcome these is to close the boom only at night and have it open during daylight hours. This might just work for the main area of the village, especially if combined with the two foregoing initiatives. What then about the other areas?

MARIENE RESERVAAT

Minutes of an emergency Exco meeting held in Rooiels at 7.30 on 10/02/99

Quorum:

G Harris (Chairman); G Scholtz; A Scholtz; E Weyers; L van Dyk.

Subject:

The chairman called the meeting in response to the wreck of "Brandy and Ginger" on the rocks at the mouth of Bakkiesbaai (Container Bay) on Sunday, 7 February. Craig Spencer of Nature Conservation had advised that the salvors (Cape Diving) were prepared to remove all debris from the area and crush it ready for transportation to a special dumping ground elsewhere in the Cape as the H/K Municipality was not prepared to dispose of the debris. A quote had been requested and could be in the region of R2000; but this would only be while the salvors were on site salvaging the engines for the insurers. The H/K municipality had indicated it was also not willing pay for the operation. The boat owner was apparently in Mauritius and not contactable. If this window of opportunity was lost, the financial and pollution consequences were potentially serious.

Decision:

As the consequences would likely affect the RE community adversely, it was unanimously decided to offer RERA financial support for the

project subject to a maximum of R2000. Further, it was decided that any costs incurred would be referred back to the owner in an effort to recover these.

Action:

The matter was discussed with RERA legal advisor Frank Raymond who confirmed the opinion that the owner was financially responsible. An open quotation was received. Craig Spencer was advised of RERA support and went ahead with the required arrangements on this premise.

From our Councillor: Changes at level of local governance

A recent Editorial in the Cape Times provides an interesting viewpoint on property rates and insights into the problems of local government finance*. The bottom line is that local authorities are picking up a greater share of responsibility, but without an increase in funding. Of interest is the fact that in the United States, municipalities have to meet about 70% of their operating costs from their own resources, while in a developing country such as Brazil, municipalities have to generate only 30% of their income. In South Africa, local government gets only 0.65% of national revenue and South African municipalities have to finance 90% of their operating costs.

What can we do about this as ratepayers and public representatives at a local level?

i) Ensure the municipality's resources are not wasted -

Where you see this happening, report it to the Town Clerk, to your local Councillor, the Ratepayers Association - if the issue is still not dealt with go to the media. Hold those with responsibility, accountable.

ii) Have representation on Councils Financial Advisory Committee -

This committee is trying to ensure that the financial position of the Council is clear to public representatives. Locally our Town Treasurer has had to cope with the introduction of a new computer system; also with new statutory requirements as to what he must report to Council. These systems are not yet functioning as well as they must. I regularly put pressure on the Treasury Department to provide adequate information for decision making.

iii) Pay your dues -

The difficulties surrounding the valuation process and valuation roll are still not behind us. Yet the truth of the matter is that municipal accounts must be paid. The Municipality has placed on record that if there are changes to a valued property as part of the appeal process - the credit will be made from the time of implementation of the valuation (June 98). While we were against using the roll until it was certified, I and the Kleinmond Councillor representing Protea-dorp were the

only votes against accepting the new valuations. If the valuation roll is not certified by June 99, I understand that the Administrator/Premier will have to approve our Council proposed rates and taxation structure for 99/2000.

iv) Ensure that others pay their dues to Council - This raises the issue of Somchem's penalty payment to the then Rooiels Local Council of R 40,000 per annum. After a long battle to get a set of accounts on the Somchem Fund held by the Municipality it appears as if Somchem still owes us R 40,000 for 1997 and some R 20,000 for 1998. A formal proposal will go to Council in February on this matter - insisting that these outstanding funds be obtained and a legal interpretation obtained as how the matter of Somchem leaving the Buffelsriver dam site affects the continued penalty of R 40,000 obtained as relief to the Rooiels (and other) community. At present from the information presented at the RERA AGM, it seems as if, once the funds for 1997 are obtained, this fund will have approximately R 32,000 available. I am not including the amount of R 20,000 for 98. Please watch developments with regard to this matter in future Breezes.

v) Objections to new valuations - If you have not objected to your new valuation and wish to do so, you can request a re-valuation at a cost of R 50.00. Council has appointed a new firm to handle interim re-valuations.

vi) The issue of equal parity on taxation of valued property (Property rates) - I have done my homework on this issue and I am happy to provide answers (obtain them if I don't have them) to any ratepayers queries. I support a situation where by the year 2001/2002 the rate in the rand is the same across the area; i.e. if you own a property worth R 400,000 in Rooiels, you will pay the same property tax as an owner with an equally valued property (same ratio ground to house) in Pringle Bay, Betty's Bay and Kleinmond. My formal proposal to the RERA was:

- * Rooiels had used the issue on parity on water costs some 3 years ago to obtain a huge reduction in Rooiels water rates and equalisation of costs to the consumer through the area. Rooiels therefore has sympathy with groups in Kleinmond who feel they are paying more than they should.
- * The Municipality/Treasury is not being transparent with regard to financial matters in the municipality and provides insufficient data to the Financial Advisory Committee to enable it to perform its advisory function adequately. This hampers all concerned in decision making at Ratepayers' and Council level.
- * Rooiels should underscore its willingness to pay the same as the other ratepayers in the area. If taxpayer A lives on a plot of R150 000 and a house of R150 000 (total R300 000) the property taxes should be the same regardless of where the house is situated - Rooiels, Betty's Bay or Kleinmond. The individual taxpayer is able to dispute the allocated valuation of his/her property through the mechanism of the Valuation Board. Dissatisfaction with

valuations is still rife across the municipal area as the new valuation roll is not certified and the objections have not all been heard. If Rooiels adopts the approach of equal participation in the tax base, it follows that it can compete equally for funds collected from the tax base. Rooiels does not want tar roads or street lighting, but does want extra environmental security, enlarged nature reserve and other facilities that would complement Rooiels' role as the entrance village of the eco-tourist area of the Kogelberg Biosphere.

* In the light of this, I recommended that the principle of phased-in parity be adopted over the next two, or perhaps three years.

vii) Municipal elections - These elections will only be held next year. As sketched in the above scenario, it is vital that public representatives be professional, informed people with skills - this is far more important than any political affiliation.

'n Dorp of 'n stad is soos 'n lewende organisme met sy eie karaktertrekke, siektes, probleme en sy eie krag. Ons klein dorp is 'n unieke organisme met 'n "groen" hart.

Saterdag, 6 Feb het die see vuis gebal (reuse deinings, magtige golwe en malende water). Ten spyte van omstandighede het 'n kajuitboot, **BRANDY AND GINGER**, met vier passasiers die kwaai see die stryd aangeknoop. 'n Kort stryd want die see het vir hulle en hulle boot op die rotse in Bakkies-baai (of Containerbaai) uitgespoeg vlak voor Pierre en Louise du Toit se uitgelegde paadjies tussen die fynbos, wat hulle pas herwin het.

Die bootongeluk het Rooiels 'n wond toegedien en adrenalien het deur die dorp gepomp. Terwyl *National Sea Rescue* met drie bote die toneel toegesnel het, het Rooielsers ook "die wond" toege-stroom. Witbloedlig-game, gereed om die gevaa te takel. Pierre het die

drenkelinge gehelp. Ander was daar om morele ondersteuning te gee - vir die dorp eerder as vir die ongedeerde passasiers.

Die see het geirriteerd die boot op die rotse probeer fynstamp om finaal daarvan ontslae te raak. Daar was 'n reuk van diesel in die lug. Die Rooielsers was onrustig.

Maandagoggend, na noodkrete van Rooiels aan die burgemeester, Julia Aalbers en Craig Spencer, het Craig en ander lede van die munisipaliteit 700 liter diesel uit die boot getap. Die dorpie het 'n bietjie geruster geslaap. Maar nog was dit het einde niet!

Op 'n ander senuweestelsel van 'n ander organisme (miskien 'n soort aasvoël) het die bootskap (!) uitgegaan dat daar koningsbuit op Rooiels se rotse lê. Gou het die aasvoëls opgedaan om te sien wat hulle van die boot kan stroop. Trouens, hulle het deur die nag in sarsies die boot gestroop. Pierre het die polisie ontbied maar die aasvoëls het die polisie 'n gat in die kop gepraat, nl. dat 'n verlate gestrande boot allemans-goed is.

Die bergingsmaatskappy het opgedaan met groot hyskrane en swaar masjinerie. Craig, Louise en Pierre het net probeer keer vir al die hervestigde plantjies en ek het gesien hoe die padskrapers oor honderde tolskulpe en kluisenaarskrappe knars in die poele waar ek altyd werkswinkels hou. Eina Rooiels! Eina see!

Dinsdag, skemer, het die toevalige vergadering van Rooielsers om die wond soos 'n Algemene Jaarvergadering gelyk, al die bekendes was daar om te help genees. Die karkas van die boot was nou al in 2 gesny en die olierge enjins het nog steeds in die water gelê.

Daar was nog die kwessie van betaal want die oorspronklike eienaar het al met sy bas in die Seychelles gesit en die Versekeringsmaatskappy wou nie betaal vir skoonmaak en wegsleep nie.

Woensdagoggend 6.30 haal Geoff my en Marius per fiets in waar ons met ons honde stap. Hy wou dringend 'n kworum kry sodat die REBV solank die R2,000 betaal om die wrak weg te ry. Andersins sou dit nog meer kos en langer vat.

Teen Woensdagaand is die boot weg. Nou moet gekneusde en verwoeste fynbos gelaaf word. Gemors word Saterdag deur die Rooielsers uit die see gehaal. Die natuur kry weer kans om te heel. Met die hulp van al die Rooielsers word Rooiels weer gesond.

Before I knew it I found myself roped in to serve on the RERA, I am honoured and hope I can make a meaningful contribution to promoting the 'Vision of Rooi-els'.

Coming originally from the Natal midlands I have been associated with Rooiels for some twenty years. I bought erf 281 eight years ago and it has grown along with my family, now and to remain, no more than two daughters and a son.

In 1979, with limited accounting and engineering experience I threw caution to the wind and together with Jenny, now my wife, an English and Latin teacher, went into business on our

own. All the early machinery was home "grown" and we had a lot of fun. For years we were sure our staff were earning more than we were, and my supportive parents-in-law stood by to feed us when things got particularly rough. Today we employ many hundreds of people in the field, here and abroad, and about fifty at the factory in Somerset West. The bulk of our production being imitation Jewellery. I'm the technical and systems man, and Jenny heads up design and marketing. Rooiels has always been a very necessary sanctuary to us. If we still have any sanity left, Rooiels can take the credit.

One point I wish to make quite clear at the outset is: I am convinced that all of us who invest time and money and enjoy Rooiels are of one mind. Little things like, if we don't want street lights, do we mean to have lights that illuminate as a street light? If we don't want the roads used as a racetrack, do we desire to create roads that can be used as one? Petty polarization that has its origins in pride and selfishness must be recognized, understood and resolved. I will not tolerate unresolved issues that might promote division within the village. All being of the same mind a little tolerance and communication should go a long way.

My Afrikaans is abysmal and it is an embarrassment, but I can understand the language well, so I apologize for sticking to one language in this introduction, it was out of

necessity - my staff regularly beg me to revert to English!

Bekendstelling: ROOIELS: DIE STORIE VAN WAAIGATBAAI / A HISTORY AND OTHER STORIES

Op 18 Desember is Rita Blake se boek oor die geskiedenis van Rooiels by 'n skemerfunksie aan huis van Tony en Griselda Hall bekendgestel. Sowat 40 Rooielsers het die geleentheid bygewoon.

Raadslid Julia Aalbers het die bekendstelling waargeneem en 'n sterk pleidooi gelewer vir die bewaring van Rooiels se unieke karakter. Ons haal aan:

Die publikasie oor die Geskiedenis van Rooiels gee vir ons, die huidige inwoners, 'n geleentheid om ons self af te vra, wat is werklik belangrik en wat is slegs van verbygaande aard?

Ek het saam met Rita en 'n paar nuuskieriges die groot langs die Rooielsrivier besoek - en onthou u moet 'n permit hê. 'n Gevoel vir die vroeë geskiedenis is opgewek tydens die besoek waar Rita noem dat daar klaarblyklik Boesmantekeninge was wat verwyder is. En dat families tot redelik onlangs daar gekamp het - sonder om 'n enkele beskadigende graffiti daar te laat.

Dit het my laat dink aan wat ons as gemeenskap gaan agterlaat in die mooi omgewing van Rooiels?

Ons het verskeie keuses - en dit gaan hoofsaaklik om keuses - om byvoorbeeld die moontlikhede te ondersoek om telefoonlyne te verwijder en 'n radiogolfondersteunende telefoonstelsel vir Rooiels daar te stel. Ons kan seker maak dat ons rioolstelsel nie 'n gevaar vir insekte, plante en die fauna van die omgewing inhoud nie; dat ons duine nie beskadig word deur te veel voetpaadjies nie; dat ons erf 324 beskerm van ontwikkeling deur alle moontlike optredes te ondersoek, insluitende die gedagte dat die gemeenskap die erf koop.

Wat ons voorgangers vir ons agtergelaat het, is 'n relatief ongeskonde Rooiels aan die voete van Klein Hangklip. Gaan ons sorg dat die volgende geslagte dieselfde van ons sê? Dit is ons uitdaging!

Intussen blyk die boek 'n treffer te wees en is die tweede druk van die Engelse uitgawe reeds aan die gang.

Kogelberg Biosphere Reserve

FIRST BIOSPHERE RESERVE IN SOUTH AFRICA

We at Rooiels are fortunate that we are in the buffer zone of the Kogelberg Biosphere Reserve - one of a world network of 330 reserves registered at UNESCO. At last the unique beauty and diversity of this area is acknowledged worldwide and protected. But how will this affect the home-owner in our town?

The reserve encompasses all the land south of the N2 and west of the Bot River. The core area stretches from Steenbras River over the undeveloped land in the mountains and includes the Palmiet River mouth and the sea reserve at Betty's Bay. Here, only activities that do not affect the environment, like hiking, birdwatching and scubadiving are allowed. The buffer zone includes the coastal and marine area from Steenbras to the Bot River mouth and all the smallholdings. Here, restricted farming, fishing and diving can be allowed. The actual towns are included in the transition zone of the reserve and the inhabitants are expected to co-operate in seeing that any development blends in with the environment and is, as far as possible, ecologically friendly.

How this is to be done is not prescribed by any rules as biospheres depend on the co-operation of everyone in the surrounding areas. The homeowners, through their ratepayers' associations and councils, are to decide what must be done. Suggestions are that nature areas in the towns

must be developed and enlarged, that all common ground must be planted with local flora and that private gardeners should be urged to do the same, that the natural habitat of any animal life be preserved and that attention be paid to recycling of waste and saving of water. A problem for Rooiels will be the eradication of alien flora as the seeds of Australian acacias like Rooikrans can germinate for 50 and more years. So our children will still be hacking away!!

A conference of all role players in the biosphere is to be held in April and all ratepayers' associations, clubs and interest groups from the surrounding towns are urged to send representatives. They are to draw up guidelines as to how the reserve is to be managed, what areas are to be preserved and what activities will be allowed where, so it is important that all viewpoints are heard. RERA will be sending representatives - if you have any good ideas or feel strongly about a matter, let them know.

As we are now 'on the map' we can be expecting more eco-tourists, especially botanists, and many research projects will be launched in our area. Property owners will be sent pamphlets and other literature about the conference and other matters.

Our community, as a township surrounded by a reserve, has been given the unique opportunity of showing how residential areas need not spoil the landscape. We must decide what picture we want to present to the tourist coming around the bend and seeing the town against the backdrop of sea and mountain. Do we want neat lawns surrounded by fibre-cement walls? Huge double-

DIE LUILEKKER LEWE VAN 'N DASSIE

Het jy geweet dat 'n dassie (*Procavia capensis*) net sowat 'n uur lank op 'n dag wei en die res van die dag in die son sit? Sowaar 'n benydenswaardige lewe! Hierdié veraf familielid van die olifant, kom nog redelik algemeen voor op Rooiels. Hulle verspreidingsgebied strek dwarsoor Afrika tot in die Midde Ooste. Hulle woon saam in kolonies tussen rotse en kom vroeg soggens en laatmiddag uit om vinnig saam te eet. Hulle het 'n paar groot voortande op die bokaak en twee paar op die onderkaak . Die kiestande word gebruik om mee te vreet terwyl

die voortande gebruik word om hulleself te verdedig en hulle pelse in stand te hou. 'n Dassie eet omrent 50gm droë plantmateriaal per dag – twee maal meer as 'n koei per liggaamsgewig. Die maag is spesial aangepas vir die hoë cellulose dieet met 'n sakkie wat bakterieë bevat wat dan die cellulose deur fermentasie opbreek.

Dassies is nie afhanklik van 'n watervoorraad nie, maar drink dit as dit beskikbaar is. Hulle verkry al hulle vogbehoeftes uit die blare wat hulle vreet. Dit is waarom hulle urine so gekonsentreerd is en die rotse langs hul blyplekke merk. Dit is interessant dat hulle 'latrines' gebruik wat gewoonlik onder oorhangende rotse is en dikwels duisende jare oud is. Argeoloë en klimatoloë kan deur ontleding van hulle faeces bepaal watter plante op 'n sekere tyd as kos beskikbaar was en wat die klimaatstoestande toe was.

Na 'n dratyd van sewe maande , gee die ma-dassie geboorte aan 2-4 kleintjies wat reeds kort na geboorte rats teen die rotse kan opklim. As 'n mens by die rotse verbyloop hoor jy soms die skerp blaf van die brandwag wat almal laat wegspaander. Die blaf word gebruik om die kolonie teen dreigende gevhaar te waarsku. Hulle maak ook ander geluide soos grom, huil en kwetter.

Dassies is die geliefkose prooi van die luiperds en arende. Op Rooiels het hulle getalle baie afgeneem as gevolg van 'n nuwe vyand - honde. Hou asseblief honde weg van die rotse, veral in September/Oktoper as die kleintjies gebore word. Ons kan almal help om dié ou inwoners van Rooiels te bewaar.

Meet Basil Moss RERA Exco: Security, Roads & Fire Control

Basil Moss was born on the Wirral in Cheshire, in 1936 and attended St Columbus College in Ireland. When he had completed his schooling, he came to help run the family farm in Firgrove. In July 1998, after 44 years on the farm, he retired from farming and is living in Rooiels and Somerset West. He is married to Elisabeth.

His Vision is to keep Rooiels rural , unspoilt and safe for all who live there permanently or on holiday

Basil reports the following:

* An onsite meeting was held recently with the roads engineer and the traffic department. The problem of speeding on Clarence Drive and the roads in Rooiels will hopefully be addressed in part before Easter.

I will be attending a meeting on this subject in Kleinmond on 24 February.

* A radio link to a 24 hr monitoring company will be investigated, if feasible this will be of immense value to permanent residents, and will be discussed at a later date.

N.B.: This does not affect any existing security system. According to the Municipality there does not seem to be a problem in this regard, but I will be attending the Police Forum meeting in Kleinmond on 1 March 1999.

* A very adequate fire plan is in place, but some plots are a real fire hazard. Remember the Betty's Bay fire , and the melted plastic gutters and some destroyed houses. Keep inflammable vegetation clear of houses. Fire extinguishers and a good hosepipe left outside are good insurance - and let's hope, not needed.

During the holiday a fatal accident took place on the R44 in Rooiels. Two people died. How long are we still going to wait for action from the authorities to implement speed calming measures?

The Story of Blossom

Historically absent in the South Western Cape, but now introduced here, "Blossom", a leopard tortoise, wandered into our lives just after New Year. A large specimen, she measured 400mm x 300mm x 200mm and was on a very determined walkabout in Reggia Road. For

fear of interference, we had already stopped some 'visitors' from playing with her, we removed her to Dieudonne where she promptly devoured 2 lettuce and part of a melon while we set about tracing her history, as they are not endemic to our area with humans and their surroundings. For the next 36 hours she remained happily in the garage venturing into the garden where she helped mow the lawn. After several phone calls we discovered that she had been kept as a pet in Kleinmond for a number of years before Nature Conservation removed her as she wasn't being cared for properly. There appears to be several 'explanations' as to how she wound up in Rooiels, none of which have been fully substantiated but she made her own way here somewhere along the line.

Craig Spencer contacted the nature conservation officer at Sea Farm who is running a tortoise project (many were incinerated during the horrific November 1997 fire). He came along to fetch her and filled us in on her history. (She has a stripe of green paint on the rear of her carapace). History aside, she obviously valued her freedom as she 'ran off' and the man from Sea Farm went home empty-handed! She reappeared two days later and demolished a lettuce and we contacted Mr Clausen of Woodpeckers small holding who contacted Mark Johns, Senior Conservation Officer, who in turn sent a junior to collect her. She 'ran off' again!! This time only as far as Erf 133, whose residents had watched all the proceedings with great interest. Third time lucky (?) she was collected and taken by Nature Conservation to the Kogelberg Reserve and joined a second leopard tortoise also removed from a house in Kleinmond. There appears to be

a third tortoise on the run somewhere between here and Kleinmond and once he has been apprehended all three will go 'home' to a reserve in the Robertson area where they are endemic.

Die muishondjie hou al agter die bossies in, maar bly óm die slang beweeg. Toe die slang toeslaan, dag ek dis verby. Maar

hier spring die muishondjie weer uit!

Die konfrontasie het so 'n kwartier geduur, waarna die muishondjie - dit was 'n wyfie - die stryd gewon-ne gegee het, sekerlik weens die digte plantegroei.

Direk hierna het die mannetjie en 'n jong muishondjie van die 1997-werpsel, nuuskierig verskyn en weer verdwyn. Later die middag het die mannetjie op 'n hoë rots in die omgewing van die voorval op sy agterpote gaan staan en sy gebied afbaken en dit onderskryf net daarna met nog 'n harde skree op die heel laagste rots.

Twee dae later merk ek die wyfie reg teen die huis: bo-op 'n rhusstruik van so 'n meter. Sy hang-sit bo-in en snuif al in die rondte. Die mannetjie kom herhaal die ge-snuifery terwyl hy kort-kort insak en dan weer snuif. Na 'n rukkie is die jong muishondjie ook daar en sy ruik aan die suurvy en die tarconamthus. Toe val dit my by: by een van Christiaan Malan se wonderlike veldpraatjies by Harold Porter het ons geleer dat as die taaibos ('n rhus) se bessie ryp is, gaan vroetel jy nie daar nie. Daar lê die kapel die voëltjes voor.

Dat ons erf redelik slangvry is, skryf ons toe aan 'n konstante teenwoordigheid van 'n muishondgesin. Dis oorbekend dat slange tweede beste daarvan afkom as 'n muishondjie en 'n slang 'n onderonsie het.

Environmental Controls at Construction Sites

Rooiels het veral die laaste tyd sleg deurgeloop onder onsensitiewe boukontrakteurs wat die omgewing verwoes en besoedel het. Streng beheermaatreëls is nou in 'n munisipale regulasie vervat. Enkeles word vir u uitgelig:

- * Construction sites shall be fenced off with mesh fencing (minimum height of 1,8m), or hazard tape, with no activities of any nature taking place beyond fenced areas.
- * Where construction sites are situated on slopes, adequate boarding (minimum of 1000mm high) is to be installed on the site perimeter to prevent building/excavated materials slipping off site.

- * All trees, shrubs, rocks and outcrops outside the demarcated construction and those specifically identified within the construction site may not be damaged or defaced in any way. Clearing or pruning of vegetation may only be carried out under the guidance of the Council's ECO.
- * All fill material imported into the area shall be free of weeds, invasive plant seeds...
- * All topsoil removed from the site must be stockpiled separately.
- * All building material must be stockpiled and adequately contained within an approved area.
- * Construction crews may not overnight in the area without written permission.

Dunes

At 10:00 on 1 February, Craig Spencer and Ral Meredith met to inspect the dune status and to recommend appropriate action:

(1) A path from the vicinity of the "*Owl and Pussy Cat*" entrance to the beach below has over many years been used by bait collectors who pump sand prawns. This has resulted in erosion. As it would be impracticable to prevent access at this point, it was agreed that poles be driven into the sand on either side of the path and cross poles be installed as steps. (Hereafter this is referred to as the 'pole system').

(2) The dune near the river mouth:

The late Dr Scott had a photograph which was taken many decades ago showing this dune with a continuous growth of vegetation rising to the top of the dune on which houses have now been built. The erosion of this dune was so serious that up to about five years ago the last remaining crest of vegetation along the top of the dune was about to disappear. A very clear demonstration of how dune restoration can be achieved is now evident at this site. This was achieved by simply depositing branches over the affected area over 2 - 3 years. Not only has the sand now built up to the top of the dune, but vegetation in the form of dune grass, blombos and other plants has been established. Apart from the humification provided by the branches, these discourage entry by man. (Craig pointed out the spoor of a genet cat and water mongoose at this site.)

Similar action could be applied to a number of damaged areas which have resulted from access to the beach. It was agreed that diplomatic approaches could be made to house owners whose paths to the beach are causing erosion. The owners would make a great contribution by taking steps to restore eroded areas along their pathways. The 'pole system' can be deployed in most cases, but the depositing of branches will be necessary in addition in certain areas. The damaged areas mentioned in this paragraph are located from the river mouth all the way to the hotel site.

(3) The dunes opposite the hotel site have suffered serious erosion. The main path leading from the parking area nearest the 'hotel site' currently goes over the top of the dune. It is recommended that a 'pole system' path be rerouted to travel along the base of the

dune. The existing path can be closed for further use by packing branches over it. Craig has agreed to install this pole system and rails will be fitted to encourage people to stay on the path. Serious erosion in one area at this site will have to be heavily packed with branches.

It is recommended that a similar inspection be conducted every six months and a written report submitted by the dunes officer to the RERA.

OOR BELIGTERS EN BELIGTES

As 'n klompie Rooielsers bymekaar kom, gaan maak hulle tog uiteindelik 'n draai by die "goeie oue tyd". So gesels ons nou die aand weer oor die groot stryd oor die koms van elektrisiteit en 'n paar mense noem weer op wat ons alles prysgegee het die dag toe die ligte "aangeswitch" is.

Julia het die aand van die bekendstelling van Rita se boek gepraat oor die stadiger pas van die vakansies in die voortyd - iets wat ons prysgegee het. Nou kan ons TV kyk, musiek speel, op ons rekenaars werk, skottelgoedwassers aanskakel, veiligheidsligte aanbring en daarmee ons lekker lees, stap, net sit en kyk, sterre kyk, rustig wees en kaartspeel met die kinders vervang met presies dít wat ons in elk geval by die huis kon gedoen het.

Maar, hierdie is nou nie 'n preek oor wat 'n vakansie behoort te wees of nie te wees nie - ek kom by my punt: **ligte**.

Ons ou dorpie begin nou ook al te lyk soos dit by die huis lyk - baie, helder ligte wat die wêreld belig en ons dalk meer tuis laat voel? Ek weet nie, ek wonder maar net.

Wat ek wel weet is dat ligte ander mense se genieting van hierdie mooie plek bederf. En daar is nie 'n enkele goeie rede vir hierdie ligte nie. Ons sekuriteitsituasie is nog glad nie van so 'n aard dat ons sekuriteitsligte of tydkakelaars moet aanbring nie; ons ontvang nie laat snags besoekers wat dalk nie die huis sal kry nie (motors het tog ligte, of hoe?); ons kan nie snags die uitsig geniet nie en daarom het ons nie nodig om die gordyne oop te hou as die ligte brand nie. En nou weet ek nie van meer motiverings vir steurende ligte nie.

Let us do something about it. Every Breeze for the past two years has addressed this problem and there has been little positive reaction as yet. This is an easily surmountable problem if the following guidelines are followed:

- * Use low wattage light bulbs, especially outside
- * Draw the curtains when lights are on at night
- * Switch off outside lights when not absolutely necessary
- * See to it that outside lights as well as inside lights which are visible from

outside, are shaded (see the sketches included for ideas)

* If you have an outside light which is not seen from inside and you tend to forget to switch it off, remove the bulb

* Inform your tenants, family and friends about light pollution

This goal is so easily attainable and the effort involved so little in comparison with the difference it will make to our quality of life here.

The RERA has been approached repeatedly to "do something" about light pollution, but this is not within the powers of this committee. The problem is referred back to the complainant to do something about making the transgressor aware of the problem. So, when you find a note under the door, please know that it was put there by someone who really cares and take note that your lights are offensive.

Let Rooiels maintain something of the good old days while enjoying the benefits of electricity. These goals can certainly exist alongside each other.

BIRD CHAT

During January our 'pet' Francolin (Fisante) produced four balls of fluff. The balls have grown into leggy adolescents who come to be hand-fed 2 or 3 times a day. We hear from southerly Rooielers that the Black Eagles (Witkruisarend) have been active around both

the old and new nests. I'm personally extremely jealous of the sighting of Blue Cranes (Bloukraanvoël) on Rooiels beach. The Mödingers kindly phoned to inform us of their presence but we didn't get there in time. The group of South Africa's national bird, according to reports, appeared to be exhausted and were battling with the south-easter - what's new? The date and time suggests they were en route to the wheatlands alongside the N2 towards Caledon, where they are seen in large numbers, but were forced down by fatigue - a rare first. As it is still officially summer lets remain on the beach!

There is an increasing number of Kelp Gulls (Swartrugmeeue) and Hartlaubs Gulls (Hartlaubse Meeu) in Rooiels, for no obvious reason and the 'hotel site' boasts a varied selection of Terns. (Sterretjies). These busy birds spend their gregarious time fishing for small fry. There are also the main two varieties of Cormorants (Duikers) in the same area in considerable numbers. The endangered Oystercatchers (Swarttobies) are thankfully still very evident and our dozy White-fronted Sandpipers, (Vaalstrandkiewiets) in spite of every obstacle, continue to produce off-spring. A new bird on our list was a solitary Greenshank (Grootpootruioter). A non-breeding Palaeartic migrant, it was foraging in pools close to the 'hotel site'. The sun-seeking Egyptian Geese (Kolgans) goslings have flown to pastures new and the adults have returned to the sanctuary of the lagoon. A pair of Blacksmith Plovers (Bontkiewiet) are becoming regular visitors to Rooiels with their distinctive call when alarmed.

Talking of alarm and moving away from our wind-blasted beach, a commotion among our resident sparrows (Huismossies) in the garden provided us with a sighting of a female Black Sparrowhawk (Swartsperwer). As sparrows rate as 'fast food' on the sparrowhawk's menu they had good reason to be alarmed! It was not the first time we'd seen the female, as her usual area is the kloof, but certainly the first so far into Rooiels. It has also been pleasing to see a Black-shouldered Kite (Blouvalk) again in Rooiels. Once a common sight it has become an infrequent visitor for some reason. However the resident Kestrels (Krantsvalk) are omnipresent, so too are the unwelcome Whitenecked Ravens (Withalskraai). The Bokmakierie have retreated to the mountain and less populated areas of Rooiels. Orange-breasted Sunbirds (Oranjeborssuikerbekkie) have begun to venture further into the southern areas of Rooiels as have the Rockjumpers (Berglyster). Remember we're always glad to hear about your sightings, especially unusual ones. Phone us on 273 8528. Happy Birding!
