RERA's 27th AGM

RERA's 27th Annual General Meeting took place on 29 December 1999 - a sweltering day. It was chaired by Basil Moss and attended by more than 65 ratepayers and a substantial number of interested parties. Mr Roche de Jager, the Town Clerk, and Mr Fanie Krige, the Town Secretary were also present.

It was unanimously agreed that access to Rooiels had to be managed in order to improve security of residents and law-enforcement. The response-time of the SAP from Kleinmond to Rooiels is at least 45 minutes. The Executive Committee was

mandated to approach the municipality urgently and to develop detailed proposals to be submitted to all residents and discussed at a special meeting called for this purpose. The meeting also resolved that Rooiels be allocated a full-time law enforcement officer.

Eldie Brink addressed the meeting on his resignation from the municipality's Financial Advisory Committee. He expressed his frustration with the limited progress made by the committee and its use as a "rubber stamp" for council decisions.

Problems with light pollution at Rooiels were discussed. In terms of the municipal by-law light must not intrude beyond the boundaries of a property - the meeting applauded.

Satisfaction regarding the progress made by Seawatch with proposals for a marine reserve was expressed.

Several people expressed their dissatisfaction with the haphazard and unpredictable manner in which refuse was removed and this will be discussed with the relevant authorities. If improvements are not evident, a protest of non-payment will be considered.

There was some heated debate regarding the alleged use of Erf 108 as a self-catering establishment and Julia Aalbers clarified the applicable regulations.

At various occasions during the meeting regret was expressed at the divisive and personal nature of recent

letters to the press by certain Rooiels residents.

Mr Diarmuid Baigrie asked members of the RERA to appraise themselves of the nature of the Arctotis dune path. Council would soon hold a meeting of interested parties and affected land-owners in an attempt to reach consensus on the final placement of this access route.

Mr Geoff Harris requested that the RERA adopt a vote of thanks to Mr Leon Kirkinis and family for the positive way in which the rezoning of erf 115, which was formerly zoned for hotel purposes, was handled.

The following persons were elected to the Executive Committee for 2000: Evette Weyers, Basil Moss, Bill Rabie, Estelle Raymond and Jenny Stark. All candidates pledged their support for the Rooiels Vision.

During 1999 RERA had a membership exceeding 50% of property owners in Rooiels - certainly a record for any ratepayers' association.

Voter Registration

A voter registration form has been included in this issue of the Breeze. If you have not yet registered to vote in our area, please do so. The local election is important as it will affect our quality of life in the village. In 1995, Rooiels had a much higher proportion of voters than Betty's Bay and Pringle Bay.

PS. The form plus ID must personally be delivered to the municipality.

Portfolio Reports

Roads

Clarence Drive

A serious accident occurred on Clarence Drive on 7 February. A Combi carrying Swiss soccer players left the road near the crest of Rooiels hill and 7 players were injured - some seriously. Fortunately the Kleinmond police and ambulance, Somerset West Accident Response Unit, a Metro team with doctor and paramedics and the Medical Team attached to the Rescue Helicopter were on the scene very quickly. It was most reassuring to watch them working as a team, all knowing exactly what was expected of them and doing it. They are well trained and efficient. Local help came from Mr & Mrs Clausen of Clarence Drive. Mrs Clausen was invaluable in overcoming the language problem. Johan Lambrechts of the Helderberg Farm Watch control room co-ordinated messages, dispatched help and kept us generally informed.

Signage has now been erected on the downhill - specifically aimed at heavy vehicles.

Internal roads

Many of our roads have been upgraded and the potholes filled. Hopefully some more work will be done before the winter rains begin. Unfortunately, better roads also mean that people tend to drive faster, though so far, no people or animals have been hurt in inner Rooiels. We would like to keep our streets a place where children,

pedestrians, cyclists, baboons and the occasional mongoose have right of way. Please encourage friends and visitors to stick to the 20km/h speed limit in Rooiels. It is amazing how little dust is generated when driving at this speed. The provision of parking at the Rooiels "Central Business District" will be completed soon, as will the circle at the 4-way stop, including paving. Watering points will be supplied for plants used in natural fynbos landscaping, which will also be done in the area around the rubbish disposal area.

Fire

The threat of run-away fires has been reduced due to the fact that a great deal of rooikrans has been cleared. A fire fighting box has also been located in the CBD. Fire hydrants throughout Rooiels have been checked and marked. A map depicting fire hydrants will be put up at the CBD

NATURE CONSERVATION

I have been on the Nature Reserve Advisory Committee for 4 years and have taken over the portfolio of Nature Conservation. The nature reserve is well established and I see many people walking in it. Even the otters enjoy sitting on the bench close to the water! They have a den in the reserve.

"Stray domestic cats are a real problem", says Craig Spencer "as they kill a lot of young birds, rodents, lizards and geckos. They compete for food with the genets and mongooses and pose a threat to the gene pool of wild cats (the black footed wildcats)".

Waste Management

Littering

Keeping Rooi Els clean is a task that, like the rooikrans, just keeps growing. There is a worrying increase in the litter left on the beach, along Clarence Drive and around the CBD. The South Easter helps every now and then by picking up plastic bags and relocating them on the other side of False Bay, but things like disposable nappies and packets of left-over takeaways tend to stay put. If we are to succeed, we require the cooperation of residents, visitors and passers-by alike. We must start by creating an awareness. *To keep Rooi Els green, keep it clean.*

Practically, this means that you never litter, and if you see someone else doing so, go over and politely ask him/her to put their rubbish in a bin, or take it away with them. This needn't be confrontational - see it as an opportunity to '*Clean-up and Green-up together*'. Businesses supplying take-away food should consider printing their containers or serviettes with a "*Keep Rooi Els Clean*" or "*stash your trash*" message.

Dogs

Dog lovers in Europe have no problem accepting the responsibility of picking up packages their dogs may leave in shared spaces. There is no reason why we can't do the same. Dogs and their owner's delight in frolicking on Rooi Els beach - we enjoy watching them. But, make sure those that follow you can confidently stretch out on the sand without any nasty surprises. We hear grumblings, so I appeal to dog owners to be pro-active and forestall confrontation with a growing number of disgusted beach users. Your 'Walkies Kit' should include a leash, a couple of plastic bags (no holes in them!) and a hand spade. Pick up your dog's parcels and we'll welcome you back anytime!

Garbage

Though close to bursting over the Christmas period, the three recycling igloos have been working well. The bright blue colour jars a bit, so we have decided to repaint them a fynbos green and paint has been donated by Prominent Paints (Pty) Ltd. A wooden

fence has been erected to screen off the area from view, and an enclosed trailer placed behind the screen. Residents are reminded to place their garbage bags INSIDE the trailer, not on the ground around it. Remember, this is where you can make a huge contribution to the Greening of Rooi Els. *stash your trash*, never leave it exposed for our fellow residents (baboons, birds and mongooses) to pilfer. Don't place your bags out on the road for collection. I suspect our baboons are smart enough to know what day of the week it is! We have been assured that municipal workers will collect all garbage from bins. If this is not happening, please inform me so that I can follow it up. The wooden structures dotted around the village are for the benefit of the public and cannot accommodate refuse bags.

Keeping Rooi Els clean is one area where even a small action can have a large impact. *Gallant Greening!*

Municipal By-Law

A light installed on the inside or outside of any Premises shall be so positioned and screened if necessary, as will ensure that it does not shine directly onto any other premises or street ...

Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any Provision of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and Liable on conviction to a fine or imprisonment or both as Determined in Section 213 of the Municipal Ordinance 1974 (*Ordinance 20 of 1974*).

Baboons

Historically, man has tended to control his environment for the sole purpose of making it immediately more comfortable for himself - usually paying little or no attention to the longterm consequences of his actions. Having caused irreparable damage to our planet and many of its species over the past 100 years, we enter the new millennium with a sense that if we are to save what is left, we must begin doing things differently. Part of this process is learning how to live in harmony with all our fellow creatures, even those large, hairy ones that mostly amuse us, but sometimes inconvenience or infuriate us! If you consider that people are the problem, not baboons, then we are the ones that need to come up with ways to reduce friction with our (sometimes) boisterous neighbours. Others may argue that

people are more intelligent (?hmm), so the challenge of conflict resolution rests with us.

Here are some guidelines for promoting harmonious co-existence:

- ◆ **Never feed baboons**

To do so is highly irresponsible and begins a process which will rapidly escalate out of control. There are bylaws that prohibit the feeding of baboons and allow for the prosecution of offenders. Make sure that food is not accessible and is kept out of sight. Secure your rubbish bins (it's quite fun to pit your wits against theirs!) and watch your bird feeding tray. Bird and baboon feeding times do not coincide. (Birds feed in the early morning and late afternoon, baboons from mid-morning to mid-afternoon). If you put just enough out for the birds, they will have their fill and leave nothing for the baboons. Baboons have been known to break a window behind which stood a tempting fruit bowl, or a bucket of honey, and once they have discovered where you keep your fruit, bread etc they will come back for more.

- ◆ **Make sure your property is not baboon-friendly**

Prevent baboons entering your home. Whether you use burglar proofing or a latch system, all openings should be less than 85mm. It's a good idea to put a reminder note by the front door - no, not for the baboons, but for you and

members of your household! Baboons are not that different from other burglars - most gain access through a door or window that has inadvertently been left open.

- ◆ **If you find a baboon in your home remember,**
 - Never turn your back
 - Keep his exit clear
 - However much you are trembling inside, show no fear
 - Having made sure he has a clear exit, move slowly and deliberately towards him making a sharp noise (e.g. clap your hands) and ask him very politely, but firmly, to leave! If you scream or panic, or throw things at him you will frighten him. Baboons have an unpleasant gut reaction to fear, and you will spend the rest of your day cleaning up!
 - When he has left, sit down, look at the funny side and remind yourself how lucky we are that intruders in Rooiels don't carry AK47's.

One last thing. If you let your home, make sure your guests are informed beforehand about how to interact with baboons and what precautions to take. We have been called to release terrified baboons trapped inside bedrooms and even locked in built-in cupboards, leaving a mess that defies description.

Die 'Ginger and Brandy' storie - 'n jaar later

Op 'n Sondag in Februarie 1999 het die 'Ginger and Brandy' op die rotse geloop in Bakkiesbaai. Almal het asem opgehou. Die grootste vrees was grootskaalse oliebesoedeling. Die vroeë en vinnige optrede van veral die REBV-komitee, en Craig Spencer se rēelings met die Munisipaliteit dat die olie met spoed uitgepomp moes word, was van kardinale belang. Daarna is die rommel wat nie deur die laaigraaf van die Munisipaliteit se kontrakteur verwys is nie, deur inwoners opgetel en die spore toegepak met klippe. Al die mense wat 'n keerwal teen reënskade veld-in kom pak het, omdat die padmasjien die natuurlike wal platgery het, se harde werk in stormwind was 'n wonderlike reddingspoging. Almal het gesien hoe 'n horde aasvoëls in motors op die bootwrak toegesak het. Dink net wat van die veld tussen die pad en die see sou geword het as die paadjies nie daar was nie! Interessanterheidshalwe, het daar binne 4 maande, 'n vreemde groen strook in die poeleitjes van die laaigraaf-spore verskyn - die wier *Ulva rigida* wat al hoe weliger daar groei. bevoordeel. Nou na nog 'n klompie maande is dit 'n digte stand wat lyk of dit uitbrei. Ons is grotendeels gereed van 'n katastrofe. Die les op die lang duur is: met vinnige optrede en samewerking kan 'n mens red wat te redde is.

Bird Chat

Over the past twelve years we have kept a monthly record of bird sightings in Rooiels and vicinity. What changes have occurred?

Rockjumpers have increased and spread southwards. They are generally uncommon in the Cape with the nearest group in Sir Lowry's Pass. *Sugarbirds*, once confined to the protea growing areas of Rooiels, have spread their wings and turned their attention to nectar rich plants - not always fynbos. In our own garden, one defended territory that included a New Zealand Christmas tree, a bottlebrush and a clump of agapanthus. We have also noticed various sunbirds in the same vicinity. With increased human settlement of the area *House sparrows* are flourishing. Two pairs of the endangered *Oystercatcher* are regularly seen around Rooiels. Unfortunately their breeding season coincides with the Christmas holidays when the beach is frequented by an ever-increasing human flock! More people in Rooiels have meant more pets, the biggest problem for birds being cats. Chicks and adult birds have always had enemies in the fynbos - mongooses, genets, snakes and other birds.

Increased demand for space has put pressure on the fast diminishing fynbos and consequently also the fauna it supports. A sad illustration of this is the decline in *Bokmakieries*. Once common all over Rooiels, they are now confined to the higher ground and the smallholdings. The species is happy with human company and is a welcome garden regular in suburbia. So, why has it declined in Rooiels? As I write, three dogs without owners or leashes, and a large black cat are roaming about freely. Could this be forcing some of our birds to find safer options? The vocal *Grassbird* may be another victim, as its nest is very close to the ground and altricial chicks have little chance of survival even with watchful parents.

The decrease in the dassie population has possibly contributed to the less frequent appearance of the *Black Eagle* but as they have more than one nest site in their territory, we shouldn't be overly concerned.
