## redaksioneel

Die Wilkense wat naby die rivier woon, het die vuurvliegies gesien wat in hulle duisende hul parings dans ge doen het tydens donkermaan in November. Ook in November het warm rooi planktonryke water ons baai binne gekom en die golwe en strand weke lank snags groen verlig. In Januarie, op die eerste maansverduistering die eeu, het die oer rooi oog van die duister maan van agter die berge oor ons koppe verbybeweeg.

Despite the little rain this season some abundance still reigns in Rooiels. The prolific francolins are fat and happy. The otters are feasting on the overabundance of small crayfish and the baboons are well fed after the festive season. The festive season with all its joys and excesses has come and gone (with fewer people arriving this year) accompanied by the expected Southeaster in full force again.

With global warming the weather patterns are slowly changing. Our sea has been observably warmer over Christmass. Changes are even occurring in the nesting and migratory habits of birds. Changes have also occurred all over the country in man-made institutions bringing new municipal boundaries. For

our town to maintain its unique character within the larger municipal structure we will have to re-negotiate with the new authorities and make them aware of our environmentally friendly Rooiels Vision. Your RERA EXCO will definitely work to accomplish this. With all the changes around us the Rooiels Vision remains a thread of idealistic continuity in the successive EXCOs of RERA. The Rooiels Vision reminds us to consider each other and to tread softly on nature and the fynbos.

Tewyl ek verduidelik dat die Rooiels Bries graag 'n onderhoud met Marilyn wil voer, raak sy aan die gesels - "Marilyn, weet wat sy in glo, en as sy iets gedoen wil kry, doen sy dit stil en effektief, maar as daar moelikheid is, dan kan daai groen oë maar skerpziende wees", sê Elizabeth.

Vir ons op Rooiels met ons positiewe omgewingsgesindheid is daai groen oë 'n goede teken.

Marilyn is al 20 jaar betrokke met Kindersorg en Gemeenskapsdiens sedert haar sosiale opleiding by die Mienie Hofmeyer Kollege op Worcester. In 1989 is sy en Floris van Rensburg getroud. Hy is 'n kabinetmaker, ook met ervaring van gemeenskapswerk met straatkinders in die Kaap. Hulle twee kinders Lano (11 jaar) en Clemmie (7 jaar) is vir haar 'n bron van groot vreugde.

## TOEGANGSBESTUUR

Die wettige instel van toegangsbestuur vind toenemend in woongebiede landswyd plaas. Die Vereniging (REBV) stel tans ondersoek in na 'n gepaste stelsel om sekuriteit in Rooi Els te verbeter.

Slegs 'n stelsel wat die goedkeuring en ondersteuning van die oorgrote meerderheid van belanghebbendes en eienaars wegdra, sal geimplimenter word.

Ons glo dat Rooi Els en die see aan almal in Suid-Afrika behoort om geniet te word, maar op so 'n wyse dat dit ook vir die nageslag behoue bly en wet en orde gehandhaaf word. Die doel van toegangsbestuur is dus nie om toegang tot Rooi Els aan enige persone te ontsê nie, maar bloot om te verseker dat die nodige meganismes in plek is om, sover moontlik, te verseker dat toegang nie met onwettige optrede gepaard gaan nie en om ook as 'n afskrikmiddel teen onwettige optrede te dien.

Toegangsbestuur is 'n baie wye begrip. Die begrip dek onder andere, die gebruik van fisiese versperrings (moontlik slegs gedurende sekere tye) die

gebruik van "slim-kaarte" om toegang te verkry, monitering vanuit 'n motor deur 'n sekuriteitsmaatskappy; moontlik die aanstel van 'n permanente wetstoepassingsbeampte; dalk 'n kamera-moniteringsstelsel, of 'n kombinasie van opsigte.

'n Vraelys hieroor is teen einde verlede jaar aan alle eienaars gestuur en waardevolle insette is vanuit die gemeenskap verkry. Die vraelys is deur 'n onafhanklike deskundige aan die Universiteit van Stellenbosch geëvalueer en 'n verslag is opgestel. Daaruit blyk dit dat daar wél in beginsel sterk steun in die gemeenskap vir 'n toegangsbestuurstelsel bestaan. Ons gaan nou voort om besonderhede en kwotasies rakende die verskeie opsigte in te win. Daarna sal die gemeenskap daaroor ingelig word en die geleentheid kry om daaroor te stem ooreenkomsdig die toepaslike verordening. Toegangsbestuur kan slegs suksesvol wees as dit die ondersteuning van die meerderheid Rooi Elzers geniet.

## ACCESS MANAGEMENT

PERA is presently investigating access management/ monitoring in Rooi Els to help prevent crime. The Council has in principle no objection to the implementation of some form of access management system, provided that the majority of Rooi Els residents are in favour thereof. No funding should however be expected from the Council.

A recent questionnaire to all property owners was evaluated by an independent sociologist at the University of Stellenbosch. The interim response rate was

47,3% of all privately-owned erven.

The findings were as follows:

- ❖ Most respondents (86,7%) were concerned about crime in Rooi Els.
- ❖ Most respondents were concerned about all 7 of the listed concerns. These were ranked as follows:
  - Burglary and Theft - 91,4%
  - Destruction of Fauna & Flora - 87,5%
  - Littering - 87,5%
  - Poaching - 86,7%
  - Reckless Driving - 84,4%
  - Illegal or Inconsiderate Parking - 84,4%
  - Vandalism - 82,8%
- ❖ Personal safety was a significant factor.
- ❖ Almost half (47,7%) of those responding had already experienced loss or damage as a result of crime.
- ❖ Most crime occurred while respondents were not in residence.
- ❖ Only 23,4% of the respondents live permanently in Rooi Els.
- ❖ most respondents are holiday or weekend residents.
- ❖ The vast majority of respondents (73,4%) were in favour of an access management system for Rooi Els with a wide variety of suggestions, ranging from electronic monitoring with cameras, physical barriers; reduced road access and increased vehicular control.
- ❖ The cost of an access management system is a significant factor but most of the respondents (68%) are prepared to financially support a suitable access management system.

The identified options will now be investigated (advantages, disadvantages and costs) and these details will be submitted to all property owners for their input in a democratic manner.

(Ons het sommer nuwe respek vir die bobbejane ook gekry wat so baie weet van fynbos!) Christine is 'n puik spreker en plaas al die inligting heellik binne historiese konteks.

Ons voël- en dierelewé is ook by die inheemse plante aangepas. Probeer om die bome in die somer gereeld te benat. Hiervoor is 'n outomatiese besproeingsstelsel die beste.

## FYNBOS CURIOSITIES

Fynbos is full of strange quirks of nature and it is always a pleasure to sit down with a good book about them, especially if it is too hot or too windy for a walk. Some of the notes that follow come from our end-of-year walks through the nature reserve. For a good book, find a copy of Richard Cowling and Dave Richardson's *Fynbos, South Africa's Unique Floral Kingdom*, Fernwood Press 1995. For a start, let's try three topics

and lets have some feedback from you.

### Fynbos in the Ice-Ages:

Uptake of water by the great ice-sheets of Antarctica and the Arctic caused sea-levels to drop. As False Bay is fairly shallow, it was empty, dry land until the ice melted, only some ten thousand years ago. At maximum glaciation, the Agulhas plain extended 160 kilometres further south than it is today. The resulting broad 'land-bridges' supply answers to otherwise puzzling plant distributions. There were some 17 phases of ice-age cold, the more recent ones lasting about 90 000 years, alternating with warm periods of 5 000 to 15 000 years. The change-overs were sometimes swift. According to fossil pollens, it took about a hundred years to go from a mid-France forest to Scandinavian tundra (dwarf frost-desert). How sensitive are the equilibria which cause such rapid changes? How fast will global warming be?

### Fynbos further back in time:

Flowering plants appeared on the scene about 100 million years ago. Great fossil deposits of wood, leaves and pollens show this. When the underground railway was being made in Washington, D.C. the diggings produced enormous heaps of soil, black with fossils. Cores drilled nearby in broad alluvial fans showed leaves much like today's plane trees used in the Cape as roadside plantings. Starting about 140 million years ago the huge super-continent called Gondwana started breaking up into today's gigantic rafts of rock, taking parts of the floras with them. Africa was the first to break away but the process was slow,

so all the pieces had time to take up shared floras. This is how the Fynbos and Australian floras, especially, come to share plants looking so much like our Protea, Erica and Restio families. Other places with fynbos-like fossils are South America, Antarctica and India.

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### Fynbos' rich post-burn mosaics:

Having seen our nature reserve develop in the three and a half years since the planned burn one can appreciate how Fynbos lives in patches making up a post-fire mosaic. Past the first 15 years or so the vegetation is, in a sense waiting for the next fire. So many plants in the Fynbos need fire to complete their life-cycle. The irregularity of burns, superimposed on previous mosaics, gives a variety of short, intense selective pressures which might be at least partly responsible for the richness of species in so many parts of the Fynbos. Many plots have a good sixty to ninety species on them. Between the houses, we need to have a method that gives a fire-like stimulus without the flame. We may be part-way towards this.

The horticulturists at Kirstenbosch have found a way of bubbling smoke through water. The resulting solution is sprayed over the soil or soaked into blotting paper. In either way the result is enhanced germination. Heat also has a stimulating effect

for some species but the soil is too good an insulator for this to be of general value. With fire being so important, everyone needs a quick guide as to the age of the vegetation since the last burn. For each of several plants (especially Proteas), count the number of zones of rapid growth, long unbranched stretches contrasting with the short, maybe branched, dormant phase which has a much shorter growth. The plant with the most growth-phase units gives the age of the veld.

So watch the path when out walking even in open places and look before breaking through the undergrowth on hot days.

Behou telefoniese kontak en bel hulle veral as daar 'n verdagte voertuig in die omgewing is. Maak seker dat u die telefoon- en selfofoonnummers van die mense in u onmiddelike omgewing byderhand het.

- Ons kan met vrymoedigheid die Kleinmond polisie bel om 'n verdagte voertuig se maak, nommer en kleur aan te meld. Hou die volgende in gedagte:
  - Die polisie reaksietyd is ongeveer 40 minute.
  - Die polisieradios werk nie in Rooiels nie.
  - Oor naweke is daar net twee beamptes aan diens, waarvan een in die kantoor moet bly.

## DIE STERREHEMEL

Die mens het hom vanaf die vroegste tye verwonder oor die

sterrehemel. Daarvan getuig oue monumente. Ons weet ook dat toe die mens landbou begin beoefen het, 'n kalender onontbeerlik geraak het en dat die sterrehemel die mens se eerste kalender was.

Vanaf die vroegste tye af tot vandag toe, is die belangrikste astronomiese gebeurtenis die wonderlike en perfekte opeenvolging van dag en nag. Hierdie feit gee ritme aan ons lewens. Al ons liggaamsfunksies is daarop ingestel. Dis in ons gene vasgelê. Ons kan uit die posisie van die son sê min of meer hoeveel daglig nog oor is, terwyl die punt waar die son saans op die horison ondergaan (wat elke dag 'n bietjie verskuif) weer vir ons sê of winter of somer in aantog is.

Saans wanneer die son onder die horison verdwyn, verskyn die eerste sterre een vir een, amper asof iemand klein lampies in die hemelruim opsteek. Mens merk dat die eerste helder ster na sonsondergang in die weste, elke aand 'n bietjie laer op die horison hang, terwyl die sterre in die ooste effens hoër sit. Jy merk ook dat sommige helder sterre anders is, spesiaal is. Anders as die oorgrote meerderheid van sterre wat in vaste patronen voorkom, is hierdie "spesiale sterre" wandelaars, reisigers. Hulle beweeg in die hemel rond en reis van konstellasies tot konstellasie. Hierdie spesiale sterre staan bekend as "planete". Die woord laat mens sommer dink aan sfere wat deur die ruimte tol – soos die aarde self. Maar hierdie woord kom oorspronklik uit Grieks, waar dit "swervers" beteken, en onderskei die planete (dws. ons mede-Sonnestelsel "bewoners") van die

sterre wat in vaste patronen aan die hemel hang.

Hierdie vaste konstellasies is nog dieselfde as toe die eerste mense die sterrehemel aanskou het; soos soveel ander voor ons in die geskiedenis. Die konstellasies sou maklik herken kon word deur enige soldaat in Julius Caesar se legioene, die burgers van antieke Athene en die swerwende Israeliete op hulle omwandelinge deur die woestyn.

Legendes is om die konsellasies verweef - soos die van Perseus en Andromeda, Hercules en Pegasus, die jagter Orion met sy glinsterende gordel en die Groot Hond wat die helderste ster in die hemel (Sirrius) in sy konstellasie het. En dan is daar die fyn sprankel van die Melkweg - die antieke weg van die gode. Die Melkweg is ons eie Sterrestelsel (een van ontelbaar baie in die Heelal). Al die sterre wat ons in die hemel sien, is deel van die Melkweg.

Die Maan neem verskeie vorme aan soos sy van dag tot dag, maand tot maand deur die hemelruim reis. Partykeer is sy 'n dun silver boog. Partykeer groei sy tot 'n kragtige sirkel van lig. En partykeer beleef die Maan 'n avontuur. Met maansverduistering lyk dit amper asof iets die maan stadig insluk totdat sy dof en rooi gloei in die maag van 'n half-deursigtige roofdier. Maar die Maan kruip altyd weer stadig, moeitevol terug - om uiteindelik weer triomfantlik en in volle glorie in die hemel te hang.

Ja, die aandhemel is vol verrassings. Verskietende sterre (meteoriete) val onverwags deur die hemelruim sodat mens tot 5

of 6 per uur op 'n perfekte helder nag kan waarneem! Soms stroom hulle eenvoudig die hemelruim binne. Die rotskuns van die KhoiSan wys hoe die verskietende sterre ook hulle betower het.

Selfs die son laat sy merk op die naghemel - as jy weet waar om te kyk. Maar dan moet 'n mens ook die sterrehemel leer ken om baie van sy wondere raak te sien.

Die naghemel is gratis. Dit gee mens perspektief oor waar jy in die Heelal inpas. Dit stimuleer 'n mens se intellek, maar spreek ook jou siel aan. En wanneer jy partymaal so eng in jou eie klein wêreldjie vaskyk, herinner dit jou dat jy deel is van iets onbeskryflik groots, dwing dit jou eenvoudig om uitwaarts, bôontoeg te kyk...

## THE GREEN FLASH

Ever heard of a mysterious green flash that sometimes occurs for about a second or two at sunset?

Yes, it exists. Few people have seen this elusive green flash, yet it is one of the most startling and colourful of sunset or sunrise phenomena, requiring patience and lots of good luck to be seen. When atmospheric conditions are just right, at the last moment of the setting Sun, a green beam of light shoots up for a few seconds immediately after sundown.

I have been privileged to see it at Rooiels – once. And judging from the wealth of material written about this subject and the enthusiasm of all those who have observed it, having seen the green flash once is enough to be hooked for life. Thereafter each sunset holds a special promise. You involuntarily find yourself holding your breath for that last second or two as the Sun sinks into the sea.

If you want to see green flashes, you must be in the right place at the right time. Green flashes are related to mirages and, according to the established theory, mirages can only occur below an astronomical horizon formed by some barrier. The ocean meets this requirement perfectly. During the summer, when the sun sets over the ocean, Rooiels offers an excellent vantage point for viewing the green flash.

This phenomenon is caused by the atmosphere bending the light from the setting sun. Blue light is bent the most - therefore in

theory the last thing we should see should be a blue flash. But, the atmosphere also scatters blue light the most. With light having to travel through more of the atmosphere when the sun is low in the sky, most of the blue light is scattered away. The resulting "compromise" is a flash of green light. But if the air is full of cloud, smog or haze, there won't be enough green light transmitted for you to see the green flash. It therefore remains a relatively rare phenomenon which is limited to clear skies.

This is a much-simplified version of a complicated and hotly debated topic to which numerous scientific papers and web sites have been devoted. It was even mentioned by the author Jules Verne in his 1882 novel, *Le Rayon-Vert*, citing an ancient legend which holds that one who has seen the green ray at sunset is incapable of being deceived in matters of sentiment and that he who has been fortunate enough once to behold it, is enabled to see closely into his own heart and to read the thoughts of others.

These are romantic thoughts indeed. But it is as good an excuse as any, to share a sundowner with a loved one at Rooiels, waiting for that elusive green flash.

## RED TIDE IN ROOIELS

All animal life in the open sea, from microscopic protozoa to whales, depend on the tiniest forms of plant life, the phytoplankton. Few species of phytoplankton exceed the size of a pinhead, yet when seen under a microscope they have beautifully sculptured surfaces or dainty spines that link one cell to the next. It has been claimed that phytoplankton accounts for 90% of the total plant production on earth, but its growth is limited to the surface skin of the sea where there is light, and to nutrient-rich water that wells up from below in response to prevailing winds and currents.

The Southeaster in Rooiels moves water away from the coast. The displaced water is replaced by upwelling currents of cold, nutrient-rich water containing phytoplankton. If a Northwesterly wind now follows, the plankton will be concentrated inshore. Calm, sunny days will ensure that the water is heated, the plankton will proliferate and begin to bloom, and provided it is the right species of phytoplankton, a red tide will form.

Red tide was first described over 3000 years ago as one of the plagues that struck the Egyptians before the Israelites were allowed to leave Egypt (Exodus 7:20-21). Most red tides are not harmful, but those that are produce toxins that accumulate in filter feeders higher up the food chain. Thus, shellfish (such as mussels, clams, oysters and abalone), as well as filter feeding fish (such as sardines, anchovy, mackerel and herring) may concentrate toxins in their flesh to poisonous levels. Fish will die from such accumulations and are therefore not usually eaten by man, but their carcasses may poison sea birds and seals. Shellfish survive high levels of accumulated toxins and therefore pose the most danger to humans who unwittingly eat contaminated specimens. People may also be affected by ingesting tainted water or from inhaling plankton-containing aerosols in sea-spray. Whales may be poisoned, either from filtering plankton directly or from eating contaminated fish (depending on the feeding habits of the whale species). In 1837, the *Cape Illustrated Monthly* reported on the stranding of millions of fish on the beaches of Table Bay, claiming that people eating the dead fish died and at the same time large numbers of dead whales were cast ashore.

The symptoms experienced by man depend on the type of toxin ingested. Paralytic toxins cause tingling and numbness of the mouth, lips and fingers and are the most dangerous since death may result from respiratory failure. Diarrhetic toxins cause nausea, abdominal pain, diarrhoea and vomiting - symptoms sometimes experienced by surfers and divers without

there necessarily being swathes of water discolouration in the area. Although found in shellfish overseas, the neurotoxins encountered in our area are usually transmitted in aerosol form and may cause irritation of the eyes and mucous membranes, persistent coughing and sneezing. During the summer of 1995/96, holidaymakers in False Bay found themselves sniffing, snorting and sneezing after inhaling neurotoxins whipped up by strong winds. Conditions persisted over the peak holiday period, causing disappointment to many upcountry folk.

\*

*Some plankton is luminescent, and when mechanically disturbed produce what fishermen have, for ages, called "firewater". Plankton can control the production of light, switching it on or off, but the purpose of their luminescence remains obscure. Luminescence differs from phosphorescence in that it is the result of chemical energy being converted into light energy, while phosphorescence requires an outside source of light. This is why a display of plankton luminescence is best on dark nights when the sea is disturbed by wind and waves.*

The Department of Marine and Coastal Management has an ongoing programme to monitor the occurrence of phytoplankton in False Bay. Water samples from Gordon's Bay are collected daily and tested along with samples of shellfish. The red tide experienced in False Bay in November/December 2000 was due to the non-toxic dinoflagellate, *Gonyaulax polygramma*.

## BOOK Review

### The Alien Clearing Handbook

for the Western Cape

by Jeremy Croudace  
(ISBN 0-620-23924-7)

This handy little book (only 40 pages) has been produced primarily for hack workers and nature lovers rather than for scientists. It identifies the major invasive species by pictures and explains the method and tools necessary for their eradication by means of pictures. This is to make the book accessible to illiterate workers also. Botanical concepts such as *serotiny* (the retention of seeds until the death of the plant) and *myrmecochory* (dispersal of seeds by ants) as well as other "tricks" employed by the species to ensure its survival are depicted. It focusses on some 17 problem plants in the Western Cape, including Port Jackson, Rooikrans, Black Wattle, Blackwood, Sesbania, Spanish Broom, Pines, Gums, Myrtle, Manatoka and Pittisporum.

# Bird Chat

Easter greetings one and all! The Christian festival of Easter is a moveable feast on the calendar, however this time of year is generally regarded as summer's swan-song and heralds the approach of winter in the Cape. But does it anymore? Gone are the south-easter free February days and the rain-sodden May days! We are increasingly aware of seasonal changes, not just locally with the vagaries of Klein Hangklip's micro-climate, but globally. The seasons have 'moved on'; October is just as likely to be 'wintery' and May, in recent years has produced gloriously sunny days etc. What on earth has this got to do with birds?

Breeding and migration are not governed by the calendar but by seasonal change. Our birding records kept since our arrival in Rood Els note that in 1995 and 1996 July and August recorded shy albatross (11), blackbrowed albatross (12), southern great petrel (17), and greatwinged petrel (23). The weather was unusually savage and these pelagic species had come into False Bay for more shelter. In contrast last year's mild July and August resulted in no sightings of these large oceanic birds. White-chinned petrels (32) with their distinctive flight pattern have always been seen more regularly. In our early Rood Els days the presence of gannets (53) in False Bay signalled the probable arrival of inclement winter weather; this is no longer the case. They are now present all year round in mid-Bay but do

venture much closer to shore in poor weather.

Our three sunbirds ( malachite (775), orangebreasted (777), lesser double-collared (783) ) are all winter breeding birds dependent on winter-flowering proteas and ericas for their nectar. Insects and spiders also form part of their diet. This is also true of the Cape sugarbird (773). Any variation in weather does affect the number of successful breeding birds and their clutches.

**Strange weather can result in bizarre behaviour in migratory birds.** The sighting of a mangrove kingfisher (431) in 1997 was such an example. At least a thousand kilometres off-course this bird had performed a "reverse" migration, i.e. it had turned right instead of left and literally gone the wrong way. We were not the only people that saw this bird and, as with all rarities, the sighting had to be, and was ratified.

Currently we have sent a report in for ratification to the Rarity Committee for a bird that has apparently done exactly the same thing.

*In mid-January we watched astonished as an African golden oriole (544) gorged itself on myaporum berries in the garden. It was a male and quite unlike any other bird in this area; our local birds were very unhappy about its presence, i.e. a stranger in town. We were unable to take a photograph which would have been a great help to the*

*Committee. It was with us for twenty minutes. Did anyone else see this very striking golden bird? It is seen only in northern Southern Africa, so please contact us !! Anyone seen the now elusive bokmakerie lately? Sadly we personally didn't see one at all last year.*

We have noted over the last two years an increase in hadeda (94) and sacrif ibis(92) - both doing well on the scraps from the local rubbish tip! Though not often seen in Rood Els, Greg Goddard's bee hives have resulted in a growing population of fork-tailed drongos (541) in the area.

There has been a decline in Cap sparrows (803), and a marked increase in house sparrows (801). In this case there is a question of hybridisation. European-starlings (757) are much more in evidence than previously noted. As you can see I have now used Robert's numbers for easy finding in the bird books. So out with those binoculars and get spotting!! Happy birding.
