

Rooiels Baboon Survey

This survey is engaging everyone to develop a better understanding of Rooiels owners' and residents' perceptions on coexisting with baboons in our conservancy, and to learn from their experience.

The survey is confidential - results are automatically combined together and the aggregated results of this survey will be shared with you and will inform discussions at the Indaba on 20 November 2021.

As you go through the survey please keep in mind that Rooiels is a registered conservancy in the Kogelberg Biosphere Reserve. Meaning that we have a commitment, and the privilege, to conserve and live as much in harmony with all nature as possible.
